The International Doctorate Programme in Criminology combines training, research and teaching. The training program is established by the Teaching Panel according to the characteristics of each candidate: PhD students with scholarship will be engaged in full-time activities also at one of the affiliated locations; PhD students without scholarship will be engaged in training and research activities at regular intervals.

The PhD Programme is entirely in English with the possibility of the recognition of the Doctor Europæus label and the development of thesis in co-supervision. During the three-year period it is possible to spend a research period abroad in international organizations and/or in European universities and research centres.

Together with the application form, candidates should submit:

- a detailed *curriculum vitae* in English;
- a research project in English. The project should briefly present the state of the art, the problem and questions of the research, the objectives and methodology, the expected results and possible limitations of the research and bibliographic references. The entire document must not exceed 20,000 characters including spaces;
- at least two letters of reference. These letters must be sent directly by the Professors to the e-mail address transcrime@unicatt.it, by and no later than the closing date of this notice;

- for graduated candidates, a self-certification of the degree held, including final mark and exam transcript, or certification of the qualification obtained abroad, with final mark and exams transcript;
- for undergraduate students: a self-certification of enrolment in a graduate programme with exams transcript, or in an academic programme abroad, with exams transcript;
- the certification of any further qualifications, such as postgraduate and specialisation courses, achieved in Italy and / or abroad, as well as exams transcript and a copy of any other qualification deemed useful for the evaluation;
- a list of publications deemed useful for the evaluation.

Admission procedure

The evaluation for admission to the PhD Programme is based on the following elements:

- a) *curriculum vitae* and other qualifications;
- b) research project;
- c) interview with at least one member of the examination board.

The evaluation is based on a scale from 0 to 70 points assigned according to the following criteria:

- a) and b) are rated from 0 to 20 points each. Only candidates achieving a total score of 30 points are admitted to the interview. The results of the assessment of a) and b) will be communicated to the candidate by e-mail and, if applicable, together with the invitation to the interview. - c) is rated from 0 to 30 points. The interview, carried out in English, aims at discussing the candidate's project and motivations and answering the questions asked by the Examination board. The oral examination will be done remotely, via Teams, and only candidates who obtain at least 20 points in the interview can be admitted to the PhD Programme.

The final ranking is the result of the sum of the scores obtained in the evaluation of a), b) and c).

Candidates are admitted to the PhD Programme based on their position in the ranking list and the number of positions available.

Scholarship

In recognition for each month of collaboration in the activities of the Transcrime Centre, PhD students enrolled in the first year can receive an additional amount up to a maximum of approx. €3,300.00 gross per year and students enrolled in the second and third year can receive an additional amount up to a maximum of approx. €5,400.00 gross per year.

The additional fee will be recalculated in case the basic amount of the scholarship established by law is updated.

The 50% increase of the scholarship for research activities abroad, provided for each scholar, will in any case be calculated on the basic amount established by law.

Financial support for competition winners living abroad

In order to promote the internationalization of the PhD Programme, winning candidates with a Graduate degree or equivalent obtained at a foreign university may receive up to € 5,000.00 for documented travel and accommodation expenses incurred during the first year of the PhD Programme for the transfer to Milan.

The PhD Programme in Business, Labour, Institutions and Criminal Justice responds to a scientific and educational project that crosses the areas of Commercial Law, Comparative Labour and Social Security Law, International Law, Criminal Law and Public Law. The programme is intended for young scholars who demonstrate an aptitude for scientific research.

In addition to the general course relating to the areas indicated above, the programme includes a research course aimed at criminal and criminological research and a research project aimed in the field of comparative law of industrial relations.

During the first year, the PhD student may be required to participate in training activities up to a maximum of 100 effective hours.

For admission to the PhD Programme, a Graduate degree in legal or economic or social subjects is required [corresponding to the classes of LMG1 (Law), LM/56 (Economics), LM/62 (Political Science), LM/63 (Public Administration) and LM/77 (Business Economics)] with a minimum final grade of 105/110 or equivalent qualification obtained abroad.

Furthermore, undergraduate candidates can be admitted to the same degree classes who have completed an average of at least 28/30 in the profit examinations and who will obtain their degree by the deadline of November 15th, 2021.

Admission to the PhD Programme is incompatible with enrolment and/or participation in the School of Specialization for Legal Professions.

All candidates are required to have an adequate knowledge of Italian and another language; if the second language is different from English, the candidate will still have to demonstrate a sufficient knowledge of English.

Admission application

Applicants must state in their application:

- that they are competing for a position on the general ranking list, possibly specifying their intention to compete exclusively for a place without a scholarship;
- to compete for positions aimed at interdisciplinary research in the criminal and criminological field, with a scholarship co-financed by the "Federico Stella" Graduate School of Criminal Justice;
- to participate for the post aimed at interdisciplinary research in the comparative industrial relations law field, with a scholarship funded by Confcommercio.

Candidates who compete for positions aimed at interdisciplinary research in the criminal and criminological or in the comparative law of industrial relations field also compete for positions in the general ranking, if they are suitable for the results of the tests and are not in a position to obtain scholarships co-funded by the "Federico Stella" Graduate School of Criminal Justice or a scholarship funded by Confcommercio.

Annex to the application

All candidates must enclose a research project with the following specifications:

- 1) abstract in English not exceeding 2,000 characters, excluding spaces;
- 2) project description equal to 10,000 characters, spaces excluded and not counting the abstract and references;
- 3) the project identifies the subject and the general theoretical premises that allow the subject to be framed within the scientific debate of the chosen disciplinary area;
- 4) the project points out the innovative features of the research.

All applicants may attach to the electronic application form:

- a copy of any other qualifications deemed useful for the evaluation, together with a list of qualifications;
- a copy of the degree thesis and of the candidate's publications considered useful for the evaluation, with the list of publications;
- copy of one of the following certifications of knowledge of the English language (which, in any case, is not a substitute for the verification of knowledge of the English

language): BEC, British Chamber of Commerce, CAE, CPE, FCE, IELTS, TOEFL, Trinity College London Certificate.

Admission Exam

Following the proposal of the Board of Professors, the Rector appoints a General Selection Board, for the allocation of positions in the general ranking list and positions with scholarship for interdisciplinary research in the criminal and criminological field and comparative law of industrial relations field, composed of five tenured professors in the disciplinary scientific fields to which the PhD Programme refers, of which at least one is related to the disciplinary scientific field IUS/17 - Criminal Law and one related to the disciplinary scientific field IUS/07 – Labour Law.

The admission exam consists of:

- 1) an evaluation of the *curriculum vitae* and of the qualifications submitted by the candidate;
- 2) an evaluation of the research project presented by the candidate;
- 3) an oral test in the subject chosen by the candidate.

In relation to the quality and the findings, each candidate is awarded up to 60 points for the evaluation of the *curriculum vitae* and qualifications; up to 30 points for the evaluation of the research project; up to 90 points for the evaluation of the oral test for a maximum total score of 180 points.

It is admitted to the oral test the candidate who has achieved a score of not less than 40/60 in the evaluation of the *curriculum vitae* and qualifications.

The research project is also evaluated on the basis of a discussion with the candidate, presented during the oral test.

The oral test is passed if the candidate obtains a score of not less than 60/90 and demonstrates an adequate knowledge of a foreign language, and if the second language is different from English, a sufficient knowledge of English.

Admission procedure

The oral test will be held in the Italian language and will consist of a test of knowledge of the candidate on the chosen subject, on topics of interest of the PhD Programme and its research areas, as well as on the propensity to scientific research.

Candidates for posts with scholarship aimed at interdisciplinary research in the criminal and criminological or in the comparative law of industrial relations field will have to take the oral test concerning the address of criminal studies or the labour law and industrial relations, in conformity with what is stated in the application.

The oral test will be followed by a verification of the knowledge of a foreign language. If the second language is different from English, the candidate will still have to demonstrate a sufficient knowledge of English.

To take the oral test in videoconference (with Microsoft Teams), candidates must exhibit a valid identity document as listed in art. 35, second subparagraph of the D.P.R. no. 445 of December 28th, 2000 (identity card, driving license, passport).

Ranking

The Selection Board for the allocation of positions in the ranking and for the assignment of scholarships aimed at interdisciplinary research in the criminal and criminological and in the comparative law of industrial relations field, evaluates the curriculum, the qualifications, the research project and the oral test. It awards a score for candidates who compete for the allocation of positions within the general ranking, for positions with sponsored scholarships aimed at interdisciplinary research in the criminal and criminological field, position with a scholarship aimed at interdisciplinary research in the comparative law of industrial relations field.

On the basis of the scores awarded, the Selection Board will form a merit ranking of the candidates for positions without sponsored scholarship, positions without scholarship and posts with sponsored scholarship aimed at interdisciplinary research in the criminal and criminological field and with a scholarship aimed at interdisciplinary research in the comparative law of industrial relations field.

The two positions with scholarship aimed at interdisciplinary research in the criminal and criminological field are awarded to the first two candidates who, having declared to compete for these positions at the time of application, meet the necessary requirements according to the outcome of the oral test, thus entering the final ranking. If these candidates in the ranking are attributed a position for which a non-sponsored scholarship or a position without scholarship is awarded, the procedure for the allocation of these positions is to consider the candidates next in line in the ranking.

The scholarship-based position aimed at interdisciplinary research in the comparative law of industrial relations field is assigned to the first candidate who had stated, in the application, their interest in taking part in the competition for this position and in case they result eligible to the oral examination in the general ranking. If this candidate is placed in the general ranking in a position with a non-finalized scholarship or a position without a scholarship, we will proceed - for the purpose of assigning that scholarship or the position without scholarship - to the selection of candidates next in line in the ranking.

The candidates who wish to apply for the Executive Doctorate position must state so in the application and present a research project in line with the title of the project associated with the position. The Executive Doctorate position cannot be assigned to candidates who did not enter the competition for this specific position.

The Admission Exam, aimed at ascertaining the preparation, the skills and knowledge of the candidate for scientific research, consists of:

- an assessment of the qualifications and the research project presented;
- an oral test.

In relation to qualifications, the Selection Board may award to each candidate up to a maximum of 30/100 points.

For the evaluation of qualifications, each candidate is required to attach to the application, under penalty of exclusion:

- *curriculum vitae*;
- The list of exams in their undergraduate and graduate programmes, with marks (also as self-certification);
- The contents, the introduction, the conclusion and the bibliography of the degree thesis.

Candidates can also attach any other documents such as publications, certification of language skills or other documentation certifying professional experiences and research relevant to the application.

To support their application, candidates are required to name 2 full professors as referees (indicating qualification, email address, telephone number), which the Selection Board may interview.

In relation to the research project that candidates are required to attach to the application, the Selection Board may award each candidate up to 40/100 points.

The research project must be maximum 2,000 words long (bibliography excluded).

The oral test is open to candidates who, in the evaluation of qualifications and the research project presented in the application, have achieved an overall score of not less than 55/100.

In relation to the oral test, the Selection Board may award each candidate up to a maximum of 30/100 points.

The oral test will include a discussion of the qualifications and the research project presented by the candidate; it will also include a verification of knowledge of the first foreign language indicated by the applicant.

The oral test is considered passed only if the candidate obtains a score of not less than 20/100 and demonstrates an adequate knowledge of the foreign language.

At the Selection Board sole discretion, candidates may be asked to carry out the oral test remotely.

Candidates may choose to carry out the whole test in Italian or in English. In this second case, the Selection Board will ask the candidates to take a specific test to check their knowledge of Italian.

To take the oral test, candidates must exhibit a valid identity document as listed in art. 35, second subparagraph of the D.P.R. no. 445 of December 28th, 2000 (identity card, driving license, passport).

The candidate who wishes to submit an application for the PhD executive reserved position must necessarily indicate this on the application. The PhD executive reserved position cannot be assigned to candidates who did not compete for this specific position.

For the 37th cycle the following research paths have been approved: Civil Procedure, Criminal Law, Philosophy of Law, Civil Law.

The admission to the PhD Programme is incompatible with participation in the School of Specialization for legal professions and any other PhD Programme.

When they apply, candidates must indicate for which path they intend to participate and attach a summary of a research project (roughly 5,000 characters including spaces).

For admission to the PhD Programme the qualifications required are four-year degrees or graduate degree, or a specialization in law at Università Cattolica del Sacro Cuore at the University or any other University, or at a University institution either Italian or foreign,

with a minimum grade of 105/110 (or equivalent) and an adequate knowledge of the English language, or German, French or Spanish in addition to a sufficient knowledge of English.

The PhD Programme in Person and legal systems connects the various disciplines of law, both positive and historical-philosophical ones, following the thread that the person is or should be "the Grundnorm", first principle, of legal systems. Therefore, it offers a common theoretical background to the study of individual issues in a fruitful research context that binds together the specific method within each legal discipline (empirical-descriptive, logical-analytical and logical-systematic) and an interdisciplinary and international comparison of issues. The PhD Programme provides, in addition to the specific individual research path that the doctoral student follows within a particular discipline under the guidance of a supervisor, appropriate interdisciplinary meetings aimed at integrating every research perspective with the intersection points with other legal subjects and relating especially to the protection of the person.

Admission procedure

The admission exam consists of:

- Evaluation of qualifications;
- Oral test in videoconference (on Microsoft Teams).

Each candidate shall be awarded up to 60 points for each of the two parts of the admission examination.

The oral test will consist of a videoconference to be held in Italian or, alternatively, in an official language of the European Union. The evaluation of qualifications and the oral test, in videoconference, are aimed at ascertaining the adequacy of the knowledge of the candidate regarding the matter of the chosen research path for the PhD Programme, as well as their attitude to the activity of scientific research. The oral test includes an interview on the research project proposed by the candidate, which will be followed by a verification of knowledge of a foreign language required for the purposes of admission to the PhD Programme.

Admission to the oral test in videoconference is open to candidates achieved in the evaluation of qualifications a score of not less than 40/60. The oral test is considered passed if the candidate obtains a score of not less than 40/60 and demonstrates an adequate knowledge of English, or of German, of French or Spanish in addition to a sufficient knowledge of English.

To take the oral test in videoconference (with Microsoft Teams), candidates must exhibit a valid identity document as listed in art. 35, second subparagraph of the D.P.R. no. 445 of December 28th, 2000 (identity card, driving license, passport).

The candidate who wishes to apply for the Executive Doctorate position must necessarily indicate so on the application and submit a research project consistent with the title of the project relating to the same position. The Executive Doctorate reserved position cannot be assigned to candidates who did not compete for this specific position.

Application for admission

Candidates must present:

1. A detailed *curriculum vitae*;
2. A research project detailed in its main parts, including an analysis of the feasibility and timelines (about 1,500 words excluding spaces). The project can be written in Italian or in English and will be discussed in English during the oral test;
3. A motivational letter in which the candidate indicates the reasons for the choice, expectations and fields of interest;
4. Two letters of professors (national and/or international) of psychological area that exhaustively detail the candidate’s characteristics and the reasons supporting the application;
5. The certification of any additional qualifications and copy of the publications deemed useful for the evaluation.

In the submission absence of the documents at points 1, 2, 3 and 4, the application will not be considered.

Sponsored scholarships cannot be assigned to candidates who did not compete specifically for them.

Admission to the PhD Programme is based on the evaluation of the *curriculum vitae*, publications of any other qualifications, the research project presented and on an oral test.

The evaluation of the *curriculum vitae*, publications, other qualifications, and the research project will assign a score up to 50/120. For the admission to the oral test the candidate should have reached in the evaluation of the *curriculum vitae*, publications, other qualifications, and research project a minimum score of 30/120.

The oral test will consist of the discussion of a report or a research article proposed by the Selection Board to which the candidate should discuss the methodological aspects of *curriculum vitae*, publications and any other qualification presented.

During the oral test the candidate will also be asked to give a brief presentation in English, followed by a discussion, of the research project presented.

The oral test will be assigned a score up to 70/120.

The allocation of positions will take place following the final ranking drawn up with the sum of the scores on the basis of n/120.

The candidates that access the PhD Programme in psychology have a compulsory attendance each year of at least 75% of the lessons offered by the PhD Programme, in order to be admitted to the next year. They are also required to undertake a period of study/research abroad of at least 3 months during the three-year period.

The PhD Programme is divided into three research profiles:

- Person, development, learning. Epistemological, theoretical and practical perspectives;
- Pedagogy (Education);
- History and literature of the modern and contemporary age.

Application for admission

To compete for admission to the PhD Programme, candidates are required to indicate in the application in which of the three research profiles they intend to participate (only one profile from a choice of three) and to send a research project, in addition to the documents required from the offices.

Admission to the Programme is based on the evaluation of the candidate’s *curriculum vitae* and the research project.

If this evaluation is equal to or greater than 40/60, the candidate is admitted to the interview (in videoconference on Microsoft Teams platform), including the debate on the proposed research project and an assessment of knowledge of English (at the Selection Board sole discretion, a foreign language other than English may be considered, only if

this choice has been justified by the candidate).

The interview is successful only if the candidate obtains a score of not less than 40/60.

Candidates must indicate for which profile – listed on the webpage of the PhD Programme – they intend to apply.

Candidates must submit a brief report (max. 10,000 characters - spaces included) in Italian on previous studies and on the scientific interests gained, producing extensive documentation of their training and of the possible scientific activity (it will be possible to attach a pdf of the thesis or any publications). In addition, they must submit a description (max. 12,000 characters - spaces included) of the research project they intend to carry out during the PhD Programme.

The doctoral path, in its multidisciplinary character, is focused on the specific skills of Social Work encompassed within the academic field SPS/07. On the one hand, the research objective covers the suffering and the existential vulnerability of individuals, families and local communities, on the other hand it studies the ability of the professions of aid (first of all social assistants) and public/private organizations of welfare (personal social services) to enable personalized intervention in order to promote, in the individual situations of need or risk, better opportunities for care/protection, recovery, prevention or promotion of social welfare.

The PhD Programme in "Sociology, Organizations, Cultures" stems from a long and fruitful experience in doctoral programs in “Sociology and Methodology of social research” and "Organizational and Directional Sciences". In particular, it integrates the theoretical and methodological knowledge of sociology with the managerial and organizational knowledge, combining high training for the academic recruitment to advanced training for companies and organizations in the rest of the labour market.

The PhD Programme benefits from a teaching staff formed by scholars from different disciplinary sectors (theory and general sociology and sociology of work and organizations, sociology of culture and communication, sociology of welfare, development of innovative social research methodologies, etc.) mostly related to the Department of Sociology at Università Cattolica and part of important research networks at national and international level, as well as committed to the professions. The candidates admitted to the doctoral program will thus have the opportunity to carry out research and write a dissertation in one of the many areas in which they will find support by the teaching staff.

International opportunities

The candidates admitted to the PhD Programme in Sociology, Organizations, Cultures that will carry out research activities within the Sociology of culture field will have the opportunity to spend a period of study at the Department of Sociology of the Northwestern University of Chicago and attend the Culture and Society Workshop organised there.

Admission procedure

Candidates must attach to their application a research project of maximum 10,000 characters (including spaces) divided as follows: Subject, brief state of the art, research question, methodology. The project written by the candidates is not binding, and they may follow a different research path in the course of the doctorate.

The Admission test, aimed at ascertaining the preparation, the skills and knowledge of the candidate for scientific research, consists of:

- An evaluation of the curriculum vitae, of any qualifications presented by the candidate, and the research project;

Below a brief profile of the thematic area with a sponsored scholarship:

"The role of women in ethical fashion"

The research aims to study the changes (with a particular focus on the protagonists) occurring in the fashion sector where it is spreading a virtuous production and consumption model in open contrast with, on the one hand, purely ostentatious styles of consumption and on the other the tendency to "disposable" styles. The latter is toxic for the human being (for the conditions under which people are forced to work) and the environment (for productive, distributive and recycling processes that are heavily polluting).

In this cultural context, women often play (or have played) an important role not only by starting entrepreneurial and creative activities inspired by those principles but also by animating consumer groups, research centres, academies and universities, or by means of communication in order to promote the circulation of information, the promotion of

environments producing clothes in line with ethical standards, the training of specific professional figures, the birth of public opinion waves.

The successful candidate, during his/her research path, will deepen these issues, analysing a reality caught in an ever-changing context in the light of the theoretical reflections of the sociology of gender, consumption, of cultural production.

Art. 7

Incompatibility

The PhD Programme is incompatible with enrolment in another course of study, specialization school (except as provided for specialty schools in the health area), PhD (except in the case of agreements with other universities for a co-supervised thesis).

Art. 8

Contributions and scholarships

Contributions required for access to and attendance at doctoral programmes at Università Cattolica is determined annually by the Board of Directors.

PhD students enrolled in the 37th cycle are required to pay annual contributions for access to Doctoral programmes for an amount of €1.516,00 to be paid in no. 3 instalments, the first upon enrolment (€516,00), the second before the 28th of February (€500,00) and the third by the 30th June each year (€500,00).

According to the Italian Law, a scholarship to attend the PhD Programme is compatible with other income earned, also on a regular basis, in the calendar year of the scholarship, provided that such income does not exceed the amount of the scholarship itself. Should these income limits be surpassed, the scholarship shall be revoked for the year in question. For the verification of the income limits, scholarship assignees shall annually declare the income earned and notify exceeding of the prescribed limit.

The scholarships are annual and are renewed on condition that the PhD student has completed the program of the activities planned for the previous year.

The amount of the scholarship, paid in monthly instalments, is € 15.343,28 per year, before social security charges. The scholarship is subject to the payment of social security contributions (in Italy INPS) separately managed in accordance with Article 2, paragraph 26, of Law no. 335 of August 8th, 1995, as amended. The scholarship is exempt from the payment of local personal income and income tax (IRPEF).

This amount shall be increased by a maximum of 50% for a total period not exceeding 18 months, if the PhD student is authorized by the Teaching Panel to carry out research activities abroad.

From the second year, each PhD student, with and without a scholarship, is insured for research activities in Italy and abroad for a budget of 10% of the gross annual amount of the scholarship, equal to €1.534,33.

Those who have previously, even partially for another PhD course, benefited from it may not be eligible for a doctorate scholarship.

Art. 9

PA employee

Current legislation on leave of absence or special leave applies to public employees admitted to the PhD Programme.

Art. 10

Rights and duties of doctoral students

PhD students are required to regularly participate in the activities set out in their curricula, and to commit to individual and guided study programmes and to carrying out the research activities assigned by the Teaching Panel.

PhD students are also required to consult the Code of Conduct of Università Cattolica and to comply with its principles and aims.
